FREE OPEN TRAINING NIGHTS Tuesday and Thursday Evenings Beginning April 7th, 2010.

Radio Control Sport Flyers has a great group of very experienced and patient pilots who are excited to help you learn how to fly - *for free!* You will receive instruction on proper field entry/exit, frequency control, courtesy, and safe operations of our flying site. You will be shown how to do a pre-flight inspection of your plane and basic engine operations and maintenance. One of our instructors will test fly your plane for the first time before flight training starts. Basic flight training includes straight & level flight, level turns, climb & descent, approach, go around, take off and landing. Most of what you learn will come from the examples given to you by your instructor and practice, practice, practice!!!

Required Items for Training:

- Trainer Aircraft with radio and field equipment.
- Transmitter and plane operation manuals.
- AMA and Jackson Co. Parks Permit

RCFS will supply Buddy Boxes (training boxes attached to your transmitter). Download the training manual from the RCSF web site. Training begins around 5:00 p.m. or when the trainers get off work. Simulator practice is strongly recommended.
